About the College:

B. P. Chaliha College, Nagarbera was established in the year 1972 in the sylvan setting of Nagarbera, embraced by the sweet flowing river Jaljali on the eastern side and a vast expanse of green field on the western side. The College was aptly named after the Ex-Chief Minister Late Bimala Prasad Chaliha, an illustrious son and an architect of modern Assam. The College is situated on the south west corner of Kamrup district, presently extending its grasp over two other neighboring districts - Barpeta and Goalpara. In addition to catering to the need of higher education in Kamrup district, it also promotes knowledge and skill among the vast mass of socioeconomically disadvantaged people of greater Nagarbera area. The College strives to achieve excellence in every possible human endeavour. The College was brought under Grant-in-Aid system on 01-09-1979. Another feature was added to its glory when Science stream was introduced in 1985. At present the College is a full-fledged Arts and Science stream offering major courses in fourteen different subjects at graduate level along with the Department of Computer Science offering B.Sc. in Computer Science. Apart from catering to the usual learning programmes of both H.S. and Three Years Degree courses under A.H.S.E.C. & G.U. The College has arranged to impart vocational Courses and Master Degree Programme in different subjects like English, Assamese, Political Science, Education under the Gauhati University Centre for Distance and online Education (GUCDOE),

About the Library:

It is one of the premier centres for learning and has the capability of helping in research & development in the greater area of Nagarbera. Since the inception of B.P. Chaliha College, Nagarbera, was established in 1972 looking at the necessity of students for the process of learning and resource development. From the beginning, the library has flourished to reach the present status due to untiring efforts of the Library Staff and the cooperation extended by the college authorities. It is our great pleasure to note that this library is catering to a reading habit in multiple directions for the student community, for the teachers irrespective of the field of different subjects, and the greater community of Nagarbera area as a whole.

Central library, B.P.Chaliha College follows the Open Access System, which reduces the gap between books and readers. Students are allowed to go to the stack area of the library and directly access their necessary books. The library is partially automated and SOUL 2.0 Integrated Library Management software is used for automation work which is provided by INFLIBNET centre. Along with printed documents (books/journals), the library also provides e-resources under the N-List. The library also has special collections of Dr. Bhupen Hazarika, Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam and Dr. Mamoni Raisam Goswam.

Mission & Vision:

The vision of the Central Library of the Bimala Prasad Chaliha College is to cater to the reading habits of the college's students and teachers, as well as the general public of greater Nagarbera. The library's mission is to provide reading and lending facilities to the college students while also creating a reading environment for the people of the Nagarbera area as a whole, with a motto "ALWAYS AT YOUR SERVICE".

Physical Infrastructures:

The 'Central Library' of B. P. Chaliha College, Nagarbera is located on the first floor of the main administrative building. The library has a total area of 330.6 square metres. The entire library building is under C.C.TV surveillance.

Milestones of the Library:

- The Library was started in 1972 and it was shifted to the first floor of the Administrative Building in August, 2013.
- Late Umesh Chandra Das was the first librarian i/c of the college.
- Library automation started with library management software SOUL 2.0 developed by INFLIBNET centre.
- CCTV cameras were installed in various prominent locations of the library.
- N-LIST services are provided by the library.
- The college also got NDLI club membership in March, 2023.
- The Barcode Enabled Circulation was introduced in the month of April, 2023.

Library Collection:

The college possesses a rich library with a sizable collection of precious books and journals, including textbooks of various subjects required for the usual academic programmes. In addition to a good number of reference books and periodicals, several newspapers in Assamese and English are available in the library. The students can have the free access facilities in the library. All students, teachers and college staff can avail library facilities for their academic and personal development. Apart from these collections - Encyclopedia Britannica, various Dictionaries (English & Assamese), Asom Sishu Sahitya Kosh and 'ViswaKosh' - an encyclopedia written in Assamese, are also available.




Fig: Library Visit Report of Students and Teachers

Future Plan:

- 1. Make the Library fully automated.
- 3. Subscription to more e-resources (e-Journals and e-Books).
- 4. Arrange more orientation programmes to attract users to the library.
- 5. Preservation of manuscript and other historical documents related to Assam.

Recommendation:

- 1. Vision and Mission of the library is to be displayed at the entrance of the library.
- 2. At the entrance of the library, there should be a display board/ flex showing library collections.
- 3. Flex for QR code of the digital library
- 4. Notice board to display library related notices.
- 5. Online attendance system for library visitors
- 6. DDC guide manual board/standee
- 7. OPAC flowchart
- 8. List of library staff to be displayed at a prominent place inside the library.
- 9. The stock of the books should be physically verified and to be tallied with the respective accession numbers.
- 10. Arrangement of book shelves of the library as per DDC class no.
- 11. Shelf list for each book shelf

- 12. Separate reference books and text books
- 13. Reference books must be increased.
- 14. Upgrade Soul 2.0 to Soul 3.0
- 15. Display 'How to access OPAC' in front of the Computer where OPAC can be accessed by the user. Web OPAC may be started at the earliest.
- 16. Journals of respective subjects should be increased.
- 17. In view of NAAC requirements, footfalls of library should be given more importance.
- 18. Automated attendance system may be installed at the entry/exit of the library to keep the daily attendance of the users.
- 19. Strengthen the infrastructure of the library.
- 20. Arrange separate orientations for newcomers.
- 21. Awareness programme is to be organised from time to time for the faculty and students for effective use of e-Resources.
- 22. DELNET membership may be taken.
- 23. ILL (InterLibrary Loan) can be initiated by the College with other nearby college libraries for Resource Sharing and for that MoU may be signed with interested college libraries of the district/state/country.
- 24. Link of IR/Digital library should be displayed on the college website.
- 25. The Statement of expenditure and account should be certified by CA.
- 26. Separate Collection on Bimala Prasad Chaliha
- 27. Separate collections of books written by the people of Nagarbera. If possible, separate manuscripts collection section is suggested for the library
- 28. The Digital Library Room should be renamed as E-Resource Center.
- 29. Internet connectivity with high speed (Jio Airfiber or any other)
- 30. Proper weeding out of unused and damaged books.
- 31. Fine rules should be amended and imposed for overdue library books.
- 32. Introduce Community Library services.
- 33. The college may participate in AssamCat/ NERCAT (Assam/ North East Region Library Catalogue for union catalogue of libraries.
- 34. Library should prepare a plan of activities before the commencement of semester class.
- 35. Few plates containing library related quotations should be displayed in various points of the library.
- 36. Maintain a visitors' comment book
- 37. Librarian may be allowed to visit other developed libraries to understand new initiatives in the library.


