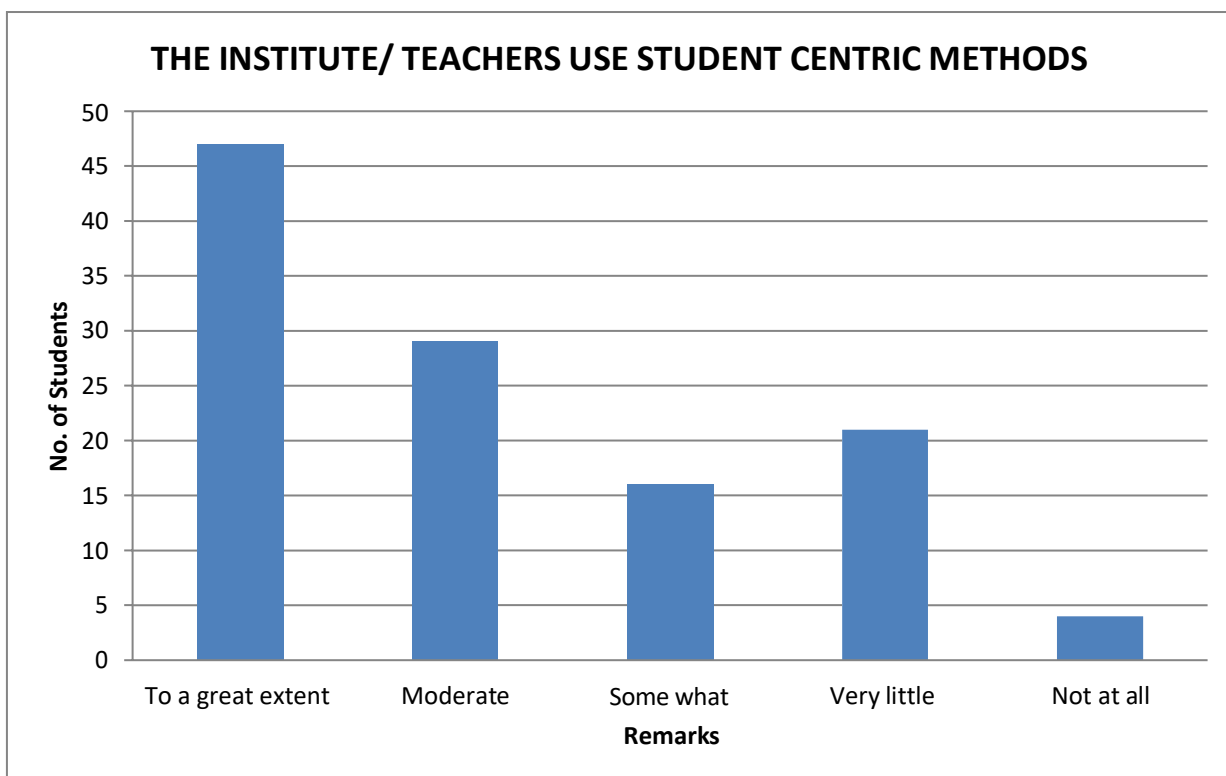

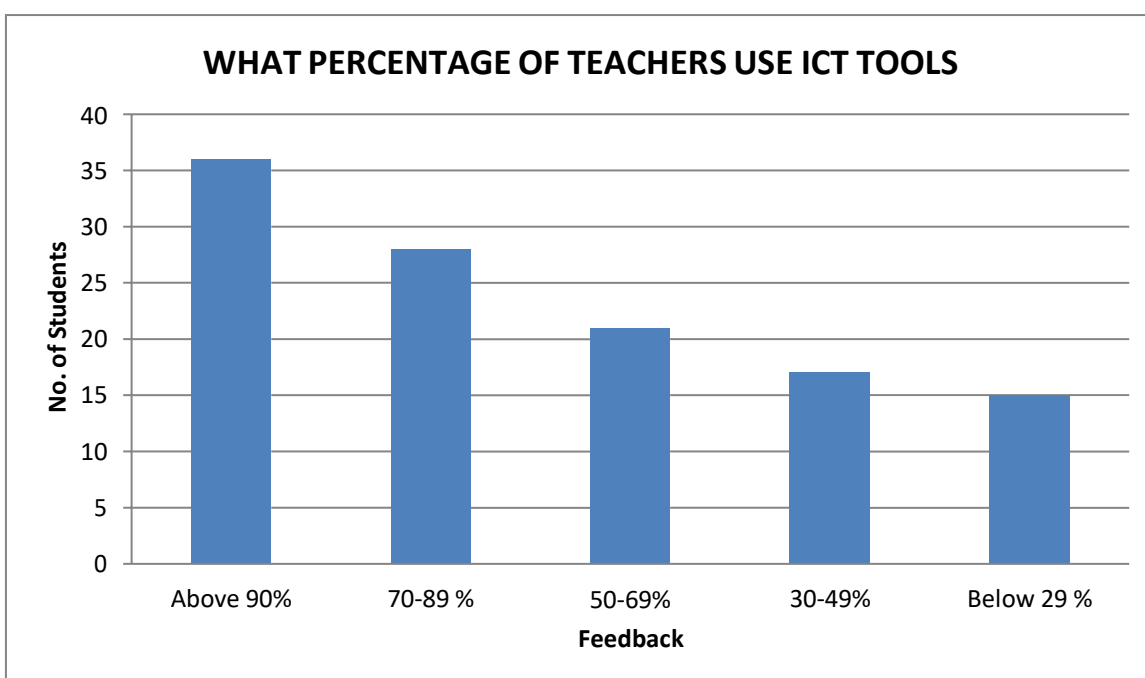

- Significant amount of students suggested about requirements of a Sports Instructor.

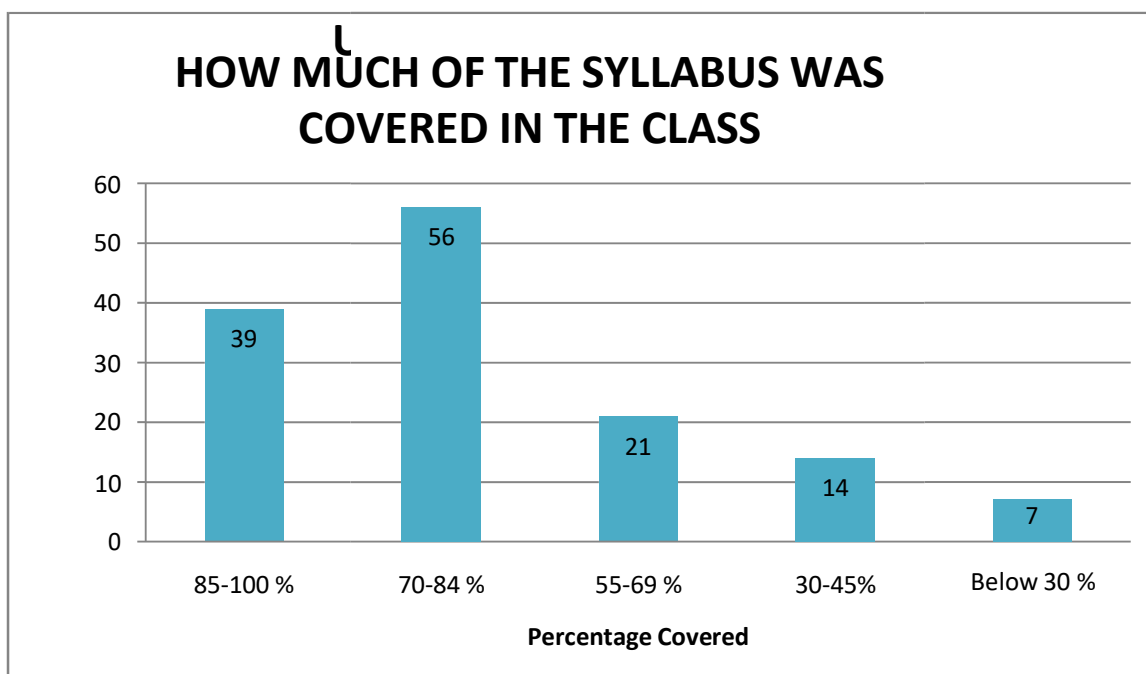

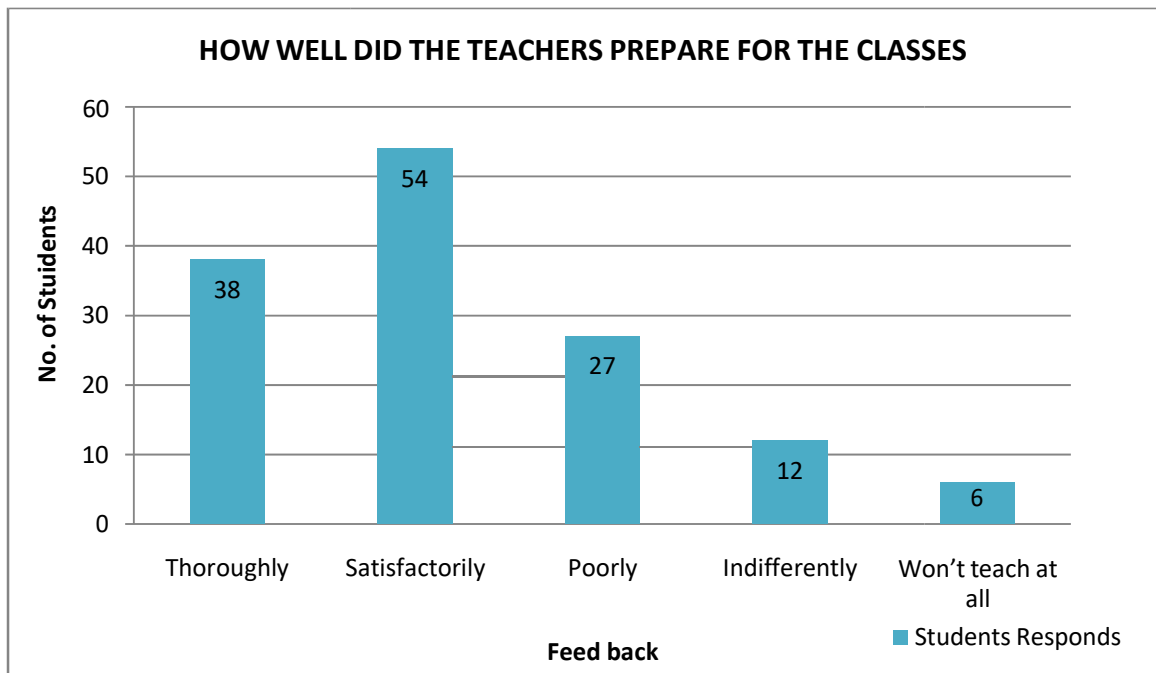

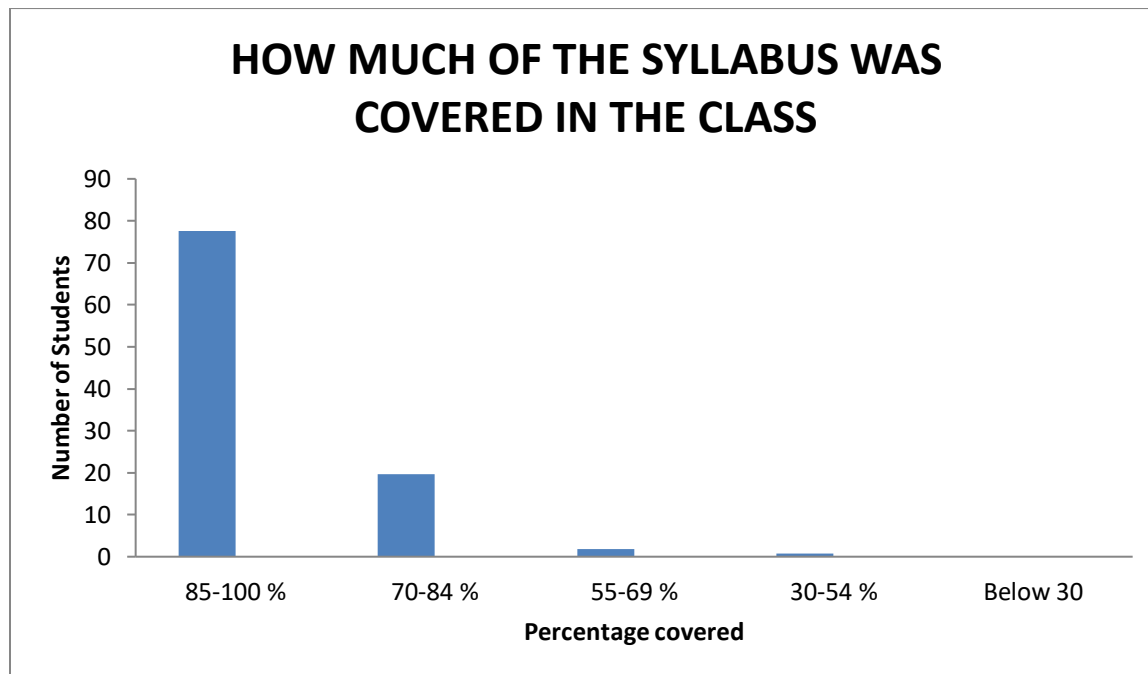

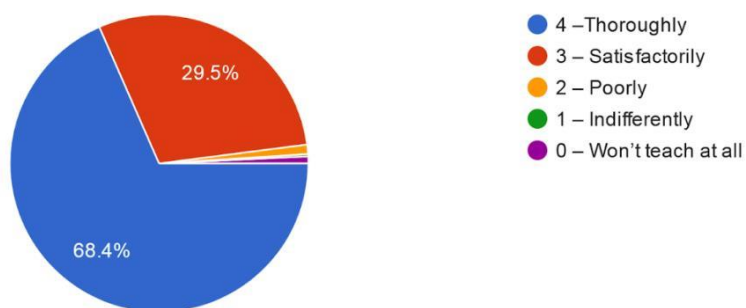

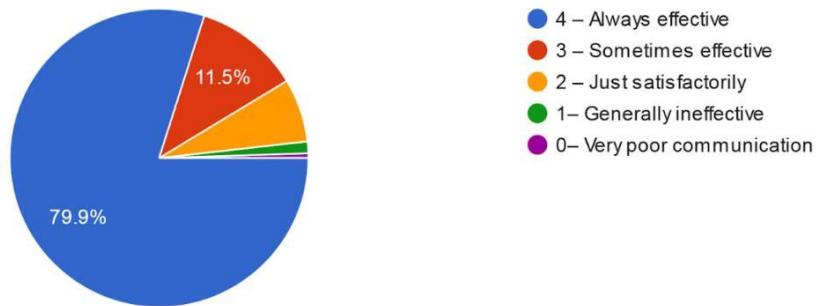

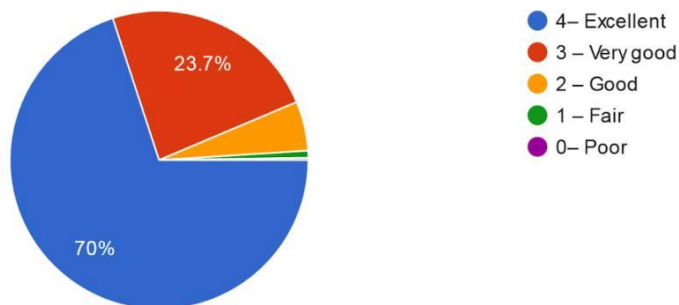

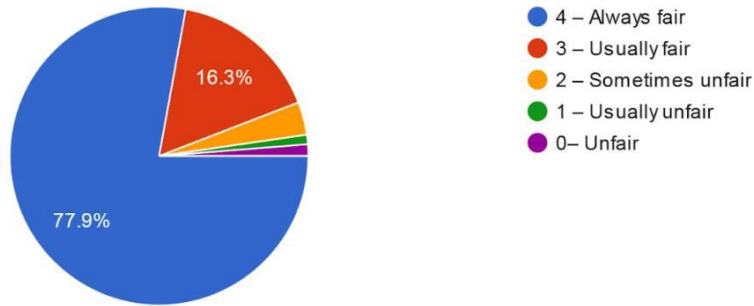

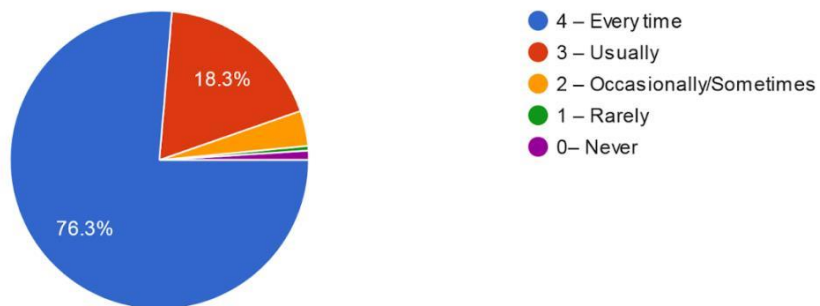

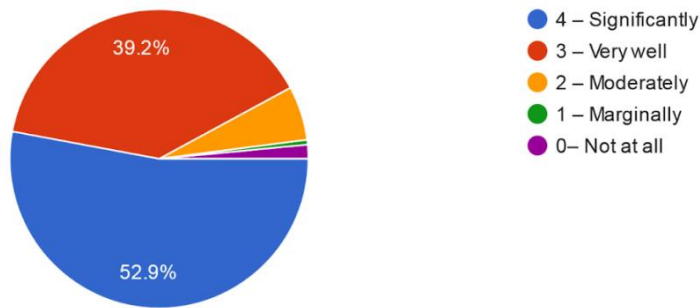

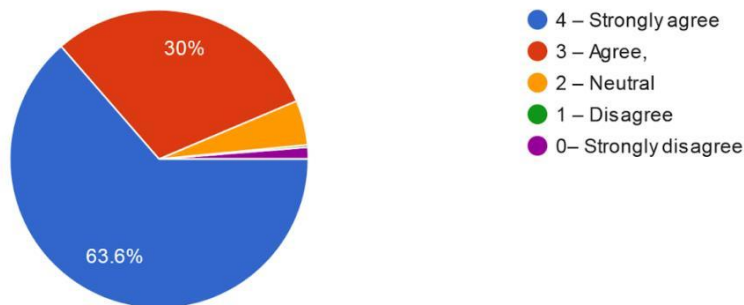

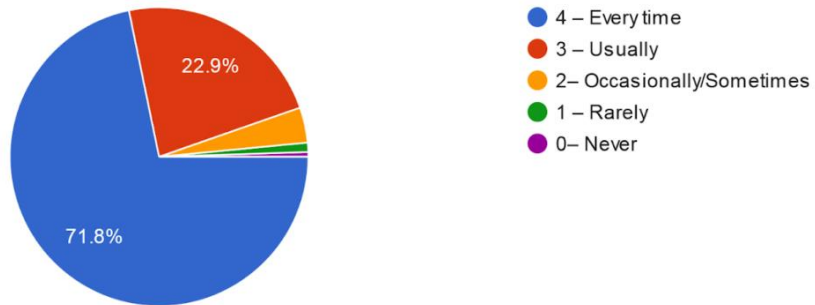

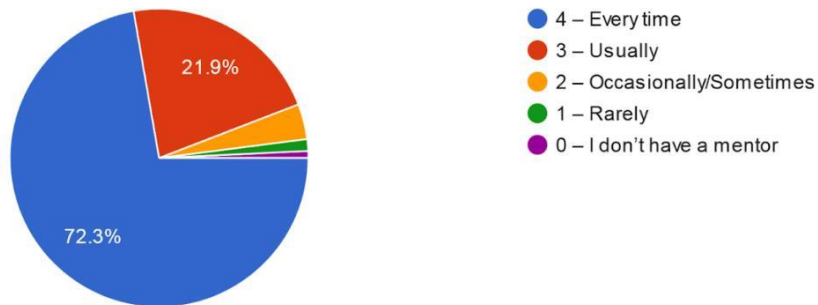

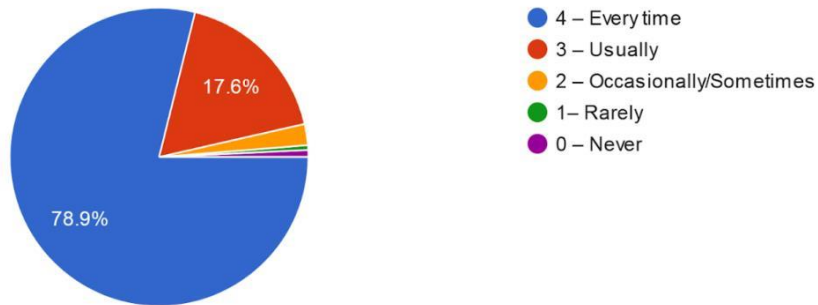

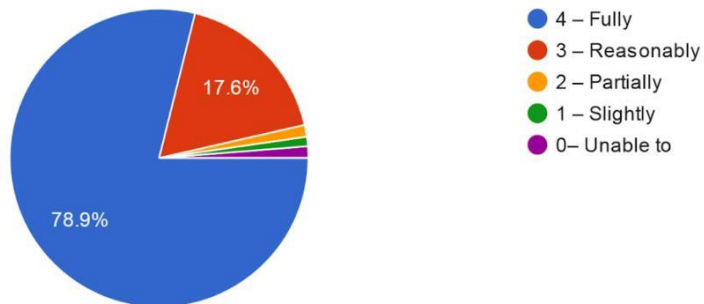

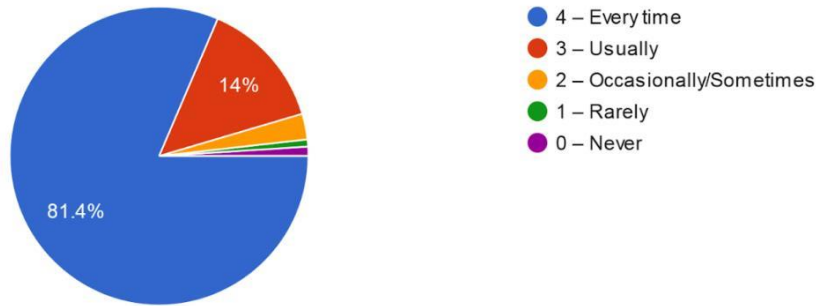

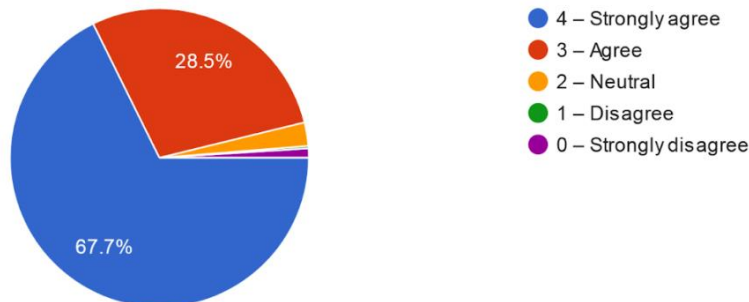

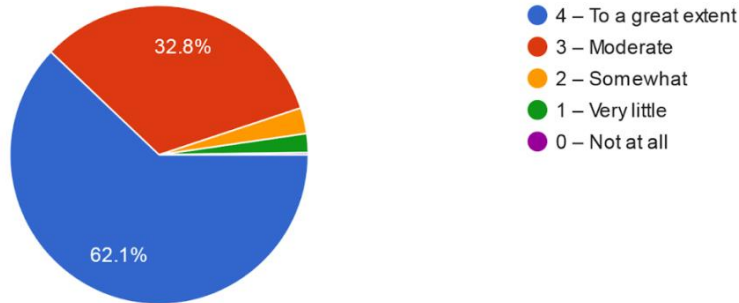

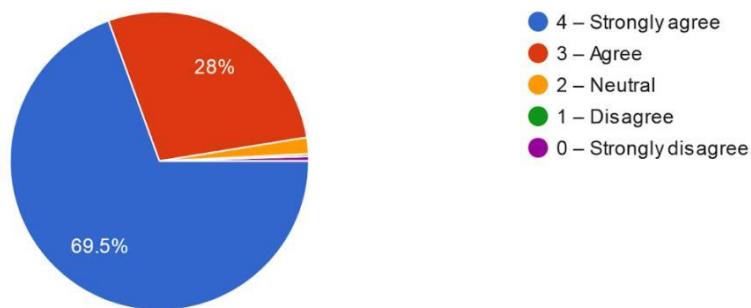

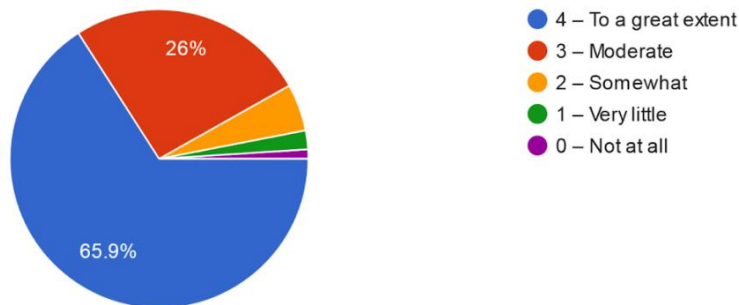

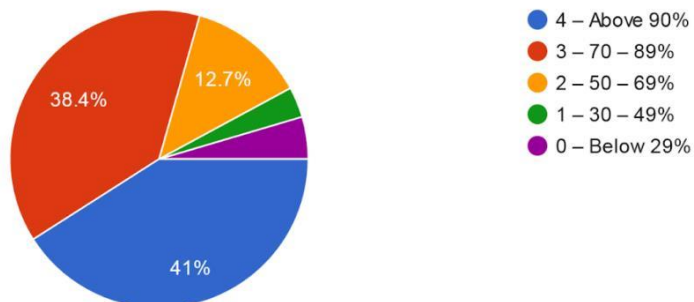

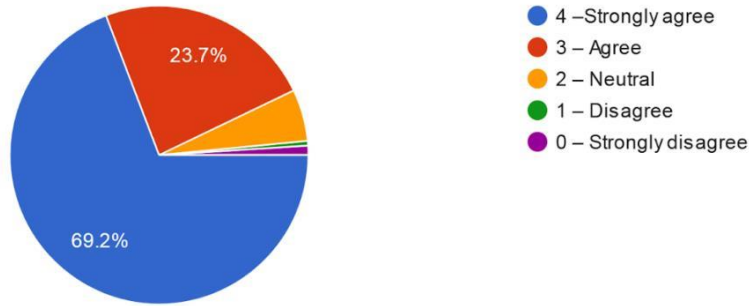
